**Weddings:** Up to and including Saturday 2nd January, attendance at weddings is limited to 25. After that date and until another review, the numbers are restricted to 6 including the celebrant.

**Funerals:** From Saturday 26th December, in line with Level 5 restrictions, the numbers in attendance at the funeral is restricted to 10. This also applies to committals and burials.

**Feast of the Epiphany:** Wednesday 6th January we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord, the visit of the Magi (wise men) as the revelation of the Incarnation of the infant Christ. The story is out! Jesus Christ, Light of the World has been born to dispel the darkness that covers its people. God's glory appears in human form. Life on earth will never be the same again. ***Epiphany Prayer: Father God, the star that led the Magi to the stable announced to the world that its Saviour was born. ### **Building a Community of Hope and Love**

Pope Francis in Fratelli Tutti in his latest encyclical looks forward to a world post-Covid19- a world where more of the same is no longer acceptable. The Pope calls upon us to model ourselves upon the Good Samaritan – to regard everyone as our neighbour, to put aside personal prejudice and historical difference and to accept our co-responsibility in creating a fair and just society that nurtures and supports all its members.

It can be hard in times like these to find hope and to feel inspired to share the Good News. But Pope Francis reminds us that we are one community and exhorts us to look beyond ourselves at the fate and faith of the wider world. We must recognise the ties that bind us – to oppose injustice, restore the planet and support those around us. It is a challenge to us both as individuals and to our parish communities to be living examples of a better way, to offer a vibrant alternative to narrow materialism, to be beacons of hope and openness in a world where increasingly we are encouraged to believe narrow self-interest should be our guiding principle. Pope Francis talks of the miracle of “kindness” which he refers to as a star “shining in the midst of darkness” that “frees us from the cruelty ...the anxiety...the frantic flurry of activity” that prevail in the contemporary era.

Mary, you are our companion along the way and the inspiration of our faith journey.

Welcome into our hearts and homes this new year.

Your openness, faith and trust touches our hearts to welcome the gifts of the Spirit,
