First Holy Communion and Confirmation 2021 While we are delighted that up to 50 people can return to Mass and other liturgies from 10th May, we are disappointed that concerning these Sacraments, government advice is as follows: “It is advised that other religious ceremonies such as Communion and Confirmation should not take place at this time”. With this in mind, we are asked throughout our diocese, that these Sacraments should be postponed until further notice. We appreciate that this will be disappointing for children, parents and families and for our teachers who do such wonderful work in preparing the children for these Sacraments

Weddings: From 10th May, up to 50 people can attend a Wedding ceremony in Church. .

Funerals: From 10th May, up to 50 people can attend a Funeral.

Parish Envelopes..We are delighted that up to 50 people can come to Mass in any Church from Monday 10th May. So we will not have the attended Collection Box in both Donaghmoynne and Lisdoonan Churches. World Communications Day – Sunday 16th May - Extract from the Message of Pope Francis

“Come and See” (John 1:46): *Communicating by Encountering People as They Are.*

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

The invitation to “come and see”, which was part of those first moving encounters of Jesus with the disciples, is also the method for all authentic human communication In order to tell the truth of life that becomes history (cf *Message for the 54th World Communications Day, 24th January 2020*). It is necessary to move beyond the complacent attitude that we “already know” certain things. Instead, we need to go and see them for ourselves, to spend time with people, to listen to their stories and to confront reality, which always in some way surprises us.”Open your eyes with wonder to what you see, let your hands touch the freshness and vitality of things, so that when others read what you write, they too can touch first-hand the vibrant miracle of life”. This was the advice that Blessed Manuel Lozano Garrido(1) offered to his fellow journalists. This year, then, I would like to devote the Message to the invitation to “come and see”, which can serve as an inspiration for all communication that strives to be clear and honest, in the press, on the internet, in the Church’s daily preaching and in political or social communication. This has always been the way that the Christian faith has been communicated, from the time of those first encounters on the banks of the River Jordan.
